Overnight DESTINATION HIGHLIGHTS

BORA BORA, FRENCH POLYNESIA

1 OVERNIGHT

31 JANUARY-1 FEBRUARY 2024

If asked to imagine paradise, the image that comes to mind likely resembles Bora Bora. The scent of vanilla and frangipani welcomes you to this incredibly photogenic locale that is beautiful from any vantage point, whether you're lying on a beach, bobbing on a boat or standing atop a hillside overlook. The landscape is dominated by two peaks – Mount Otemanu and Mount Pahia – both more than 610 metres high. Take amazing photos as you cruise around Bora Bora's dazzling lagoon, go snorkelling to discover the brightly coloured marine life or head off on an exciting off-road adventure across the island.

AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND

1 OVERNIGHT | 12-13 FEBRUARY 2024

The Maori name for Auckland roughly translates to "city of many lovers" – named for the myriad cultures that have loved this place. Sailing past picturesque islands as the city skyline comes into focus, you also will become one of its many lovers. Partake in urban adventures at museums and cultural sites in New Zealand's most cosmopolitan city, or experience spectacular landscapes from luminescent caves to working sheep farms to rugged beaches that host raucous gannet colonies. Wherever you find yourself, when it's time to eat, the region's rich farmlands provide the freshest of ingredients and award-winning wines.

SYDNEY, AUSTRALIA

1 OVERNIGHT | 22-23 FEBRUARY 2024

Like all great cities, Sydney has many iconic sights worthy of your attention, from the Sydney Harbour Bridge and Sydney Opera House to Bondi Beach. But don't stop there. Around every corner is a fascinating neighbourhood, hidden garden or

unique museum waiting to be added to the reasons that this city enchants you. Though not as grand as the Royal Botanic Garden, Wendy's Secret Garden offers lovely views of the harbour in a tranquil setting. And while it may not be comparable to the massive Art Gallery of NSW, the White Rabbit Gallery boasts one of the world's largest and most significant collections of contemporary Chinese art.

BALI (BENOA), INDONESIA

1 OVERNIGHT | 8-9 MARCH 2024

Breathtaking Bali is an interesting mix of modern and traditional culture. Once a remote destination that could be reached only with a fair amount of effort, the island has become a haven for serenity seekers from around the world. Part of its draw is spiritual – there are gorgeous Hindu temples throughout the island, and the town of Ubud in particular has become a centre for yoga practitioners. But there's also quite a vibrant nightlife scene in Kuta, and the surfing is top-notch. For a special treat, hire a guide and visit the Jatiluwih Rice Terraces, a gorgeous UNESCO World Heritage site that demonstrates how harmoniously man and nature can interact.

TOKYO, JAPAN

1 OVERNIGHT | 24-25 MARCH 2024

Tokyo perfectly combines reverence for tradition with cutting-edge technology and culture, so you'll want to visit the ancient shrines and formal gardens as well as the modern Tokyo Tower that soars above it all. You can expect to encounter a lot of people in a city of millions, but you can also find quiet spots in which to relax, such as lovely Ueno Park. If the cherry blossoms are in bloom, even the parks will be bustling with viewing parties known as hanami, so your best bet is to put on your walking shoes and join the throng. Visit the temple, eat the sushi, sing the karaoke, buy the kimono and embrace this fascinating city.



KYOTO (KOBE), JAPAN

1 OVERNIGHT | 27-28 MARCH 2024

Packed with 17 UNESCO World Heritage sites, Japan's compelling imperial capital of Kyoto is less than 15 metres from the port of Kobe, which is also close to other wonderful sights. The more ancient imperial capital of Nara has its own share of UNESCO sites nearby, while the gilded tigers adorning Osaka Castle can be found even closer to the port. Kobe itself also has plenty to offer, from parks and museums to chic restaurants serving the city's succulent namesake beef. Whether you enjoy a traditional tea ceremony performed by geishas in Kyoto or go for a hike on Mount Rokko outside Kobe, you'll experience some of Japan's greatest icons.

SHANGHAI, CHINA

2 OVERNIGHTS | 2-4 APRIL 2024

Standing on The Bund gazing across the Huangpu River to a forest of skyscrapers, it will be hard to believe that a few decades ago there was barely a building over 10 stories here. While the global economy has transformed Shanghai's skyline, you can still find history and culture during a quiet moment in the 16th-century Yuyuan Garden. Or try shopping for yixing teapots, jade and 3D kitten photos and savouring pan-fried dumplings and scallion pancakes in the Old City. For the hip and modern, head to M50, a collection of factories and cotton mills that have been turned into galleries, and view works of established and emerging Chinese artists.

HONG KONG, CHINA

1 OVERNIGHT | 7-8 APRIL 2024

Only in Hong Kong can you wander through a magical flower tunnel hidden in a housing complex, ride the world's longest escalator, stand at the base of the world's tallest seated bronze Buddha and visit a model of Noah's Ark. In fact, you'll find yourself uttering "only in Hong Kong" a lot, whether scaling an impossibly steep hillside on a funicular tramway to Victoria Peak, dining on dim sum at one of the world's cheapest Michelin-starred restaurants or perusing goldfish at the Tung Choi Street Goldfish Market. Start the day by getting fitted for a tailored cashmere suit and end it by shopping for luxury brand knockoffs at the Ladies' Market.

HANOI (HA LONG BAY), VIETNAM

1 OVERNIGHT | 10-11 APRIL 2024

Exploring the streets and neighbourhoods of Hanoi, you'll find the city's tumultuous past and enduring spirit everywhere. Standing in front of the French Colonial architecture of the opera house and St. Joseph's Cathedral inspired by Notre Dame, you will feel like you are in Paris instead of Southeast Asia. Then Vietnam's culture unfolds in the 11th-century architecture of the Imperial Citadel and Temple of Literature and in Ba Dinh Square, where Ho Chi Minh read the Proclamation of Independence in 1945. Equally unforgettable is the natural beauty of Ha Long Bay, an amazing UNESCO-listed landscape dotted with hundreds of limestone islands.

HUE (CHAN MAY), VIETNAM

1 OVERNIGHT | 12-13 APRIL 2024

In Chan May you're ideally situated between centuries of history dating to the Nguyen dynasty in Hue and the modern tumult of the 20th century in Da Nang. The vast Complex of Hue Monuments follows the natural beauty of the Perfume River from a walled imperial city to ornate temples and tombs. This UNESCO site offers a look at Vietnam before the 20th century, but you'll also see evidence of the Vietnam War in the bombed remains of the Forbidden Purple City. That time in history is more evident in Da Nang, where you can tour a replica of Ho Chi Minh's residence and peek through bullet holes left from the war in the caves of the Marble Mountains.

SAIGON (HO CHI MINH CITY), VIETNAM

1 OVERNIGHT | 15-16 APRIL 2024

A lot has changed since the iconic evacuation photos were taken during the fall of Saigon in 1975 including its name, Ho Chi Minh City. Nowhere is the evolution more obvious than when you view the city from the 81st-floor observation deck of Vietnam's tallest building. Still, Ho Chi Minh City retains its unique culture and wears its battle scars with honour. You'll experience this in the elaborate French Colonial architecture and grand arches of the 19th-century post office as well as the Cu Chi Tunnels built during the war. Explore Vietnam's history in the fascinating museums and pagodas, and watch modern life unfold in bustling markets.



Overnight DESTINATION HIGHLIGHTS

BANGKOK, THAILAND

1 OVERNIGHT | 18-19 APRIL 2024

Bangkok has fabulous streets in which to get lost — and to eat. As you explore, notice what is missing as well as what's there, for you'll find a distinct absence of ancient relics and European colonial influence. At the Grand Palace you may detect an occasional Western flourish, but this royal compound undeniably salutes the craftsmanship and creativity of Thailand. Staring at the almost 5 metre foot of a massive gold Buddha in the young city's oldest temple, you'll note that it dates only to the 18th century. To explore ancient history, visit Bangkok's excellent museums or travel north to the ruins of Ayutthaya, the historic capital of Siam.

SINGAPORE, SINGAPORE

1 OVERNIGHT | 22-23 APRIL 2024

Discover the delightful diversity of Singapore, from charming Chinatown to colourful Little India to Arab Street and the massive Sultan Mosque. Learn about the many Asian cultures that have influenced Singapore at The Asian Civilisations Museum, which houses one of the most comprehensive pan-Asian collections in the region. Gaze at 20,000 beautiful blooms in the National Orchid Garden and observe nocturnal creatures in their natural habitat on the unique night safari. For a historical perspective, visit the Kranji War Memorial and the Changi Chapel and Museum, dedicated to those who lost their lives during World War II.

YANGON, MYANMAR

2 OVERNIGHTS | 28-30 APRIL 2024

Formerly known as Rangoon, Yangon is the largest city in Myanmar and yet retains an old-school feel that is rare for a city of millions. You'll find more quaint colonial buildings than slick skyscrapers, and its most famous structure – the heavenly Shwedagon Pagoda – is about 2,600 years old. Beyond that

golden icon, the gilded Sule and Botataung pagodas are also worth visiting. To get an authentic feel for the entire city, the Yangon Circular Railway makes a three-hour loop around town and gives you the chance to rub elbows – literally – with the locals. When you need to refuel, try a bowl of mohinga, a delicious fish soup with rice noodles.

MUMBAI, INDIA

1 OVERNIGHT | 7-8 MAY 2024

India's largest city, Mumbai is home to 20 million people, seemingly all on the go. A good place to start your visit is the Gateway of India, an arch monument built for England's King George and Queen Mary in 1924 that has become an iconic symbol of the city. After that, your senses may kick into overdrive – from the bright flowers and fragrant incense used in daily Hindu rituals to the constant thrum of traffic and rush of pedestrians on busy streets. But there's always somewhere to slow down, like the seaside promenade of Marine Drive or even an air-conditioned movie theatre, where you can take in a locally produced Bollywood production.

DUBAI, UAE

1 OVERNIGHT | 12-13 MAY 2024

As Dubai has carved its place in the vast desert as a glittering tribute to all that money can buy, you may find it hard to believe that the city's skyline had only a few modest high-rises as recently as the 1990s. After learning about the monumental journey from fishing village to international symbol of opulence at the Dubai Museum, discover for yourself what all the fuss is about in this city of superlatives. Ride the world's longest elevator to the top of the world's tallest building, shop in the world's largest mall, ski the world's first indoor black-diamond run or lounge on a white sand beach on the world's largest artificial island.



LUXOR (SAFAGA), EGYPT

1 OVERNIGHT | 24-25 MAY 2024

Long before bucket lists, there was Luxor, the site of the ancient city of Thebes and a breathtaking monument to the awesome power and wealth of Egyptian pharaohs during the 16th to the 11th centuries BC. As you stand in a 4,650-square-metre hall at the base of columns towering over 26 metres, your size and place in this ancient world will not be difficult to determine. For a humbler take on life in the desert, travel to a Bedouin settlement to sip tea, break bread and learn about this nomadic culture, or spend the day relaxing on the Red Sea Riviera, where travellers flock for some of the best snorkelling and diving in the world.

JERUSALEM (HAIFA), ISRAEL

1 OVERNIGHT | 28-29 MAY 2024

While the majority of the population is Jewish, Haifa is a diverse melting pot of cultures and faiths. Consider the German Colony, established in the 1800s by German Templars and now a prime tourist area thanks to its excellent restaurants and view of the Bahá'í Gardens. Nearby is Stella Maris Monastery, a beautiful Catholic abbey. Likewise, you'll find historic sites sacred to Jews, Christians and Muslims if you travel south to Jerusalem, one of the world's holiest cities and home to treasures such as the Dome of the Rock, Western Wall, Damascus Gate, Church of the Holy Sepulcher and more. Prepare for ample walking and amazement.

BARCELONA, SPAIN

1 OVERNIGHT | 5-6 JUNE 2024

With broad boulevards, big skies and intriguing architecture competing for your eye at every turn, Barcelona is a city unlike any other. The streets beg to be walked, as you can amble through the centuries with a stroll from the narrow medieval alleyways of the Gothic Quarter to the modern heart of La Rambla. Along this wide, tree-lined promenade, experience the full gamut of Catalonian culture, from whimsical Gaudí homes to tapas bars to street performers to bustling La Boqueria market. You'll also discover natural escapes nearby if you simply climb the hill to Park Güell, where you'll see more of Gaudí's unmistakable imprint on the city.

SEVILLE, SPAIN

1 OVERNIGHT | 10-11 JUNE 2024

You'll easily fall in love with Seville. The city is just right - big enough to have lots to do but small enough to feel intimate, with enough visitors to be tourist-friendly without being a tourist trap. Get lost in the winding streets of the Santa Cruz neighbourhood, or let your eyes skim the residential rooftops as you sip a glass of wine on the balcony of the Metropol Parasol - known locally as Las Setas, or "the mushrooms" – a modern structure built above ancient Roman and Moorish ruins. Be sure you also make time for Seville Cathedral, a beloved centre of worship in this heavily Catholic region, and of course, the famed Alcázar palace.

BORDEAUX, FRANCE

1 OVERNIGHT | 17-18 JUNE 2024


Along a curve in the Garonne River rises the iconic 18th-century architecture of Bordeaux, a brilliant unity of medieval roots, neoclassical style and urban planning so remarkably revitalised that half the city was declared a UNESCO World Heritage site in 2007. Stroll through this divine cityscape defined by its parchment-coloured buildings and wide-open squares, the largest of which is the 30-acre Esplanade de Quinconces. The only thing that could draw you outside of a city this gorgeous would be wine regions as revered as Médoc and Saint-Émilion and the elegant countryside châteaux where you can taste these renowned vintages.

REYKJAVIK, ICELAND

1 OVERNIGHT | 29-30 JUNE 2024

Although it's one of the smallest capitals in the world, Reykjavik is home to two-thirds of Iceland's population, making it the ideal place to immerse yourself in the local culture. The city exists in harmony with the strikingly beautiful landscapes surrounding it, reflected in places such as the botanical gardens, the Reykjavik Art Museum and the Reykjavik Maritime Museum. Experience the majestic countryside firsthand with a day trip to Geysir - an erupting hot spring - and the nearby waterfall of Gullfoss. For a different sort of adventure, try some harkarl - fermented shark - or play it safe and stick with traditional Icelandic fish stew.







GREAT BARRIER ISLAND ADVENTURE

2 NIGHTS | 13 FEBRUARY 2024 AUCKLAND TO NAPIER

Fly to sparsely populated, densely forested Great Barrier Island and release your inner adventurer where Mother Nature reigns supreme. Go deep-sea fishing for giant kingfish and hard-fighting snapper. Walk a beach so secluded it's like being Robinson Crusoe. Be awed by the incredible clarity and radiance of the stars as the island is an official Dark Sky Sanctuary. In Napier, tour the world-famous Art Deco City in an authentic vintage car before returning to the ship.

NEW ZEALAND'S SOUTHERN GRANDEUR

1 NIGHT | 18 FEBRUARY 2024 DUNEDIN TO MILFORD SOUND

Although relatively short, this adventure is long on scenic beauty, beginning with a jaw-dropping drive through Fiordland National Park. The mesmerising sights continue underground in Te Anau's twisting limestone caves, which a sea of glowworms illuminates. For the ultimate sky-high view of Queenstown, take the gondola to the summit of Bob's Peak, and cruise to a high-country homestead aboard a vintage steamship for a taste of farm life. An inspired wine tasting and strolling about historic Arrowtown and Scottish-influenced Dunedin are equally gratifying.

WOLGAN VALLEY ESCAPE

2 NIGHTS | 23 FEBRUARY 2024 SYDNEY TO BRISBANE

Get away to the remote Wolgan Valley within the Blue Mountains, a natural landscape so glorious that UNESCO deemed it a World Heritage site. Gaze out over epic escarpments and thundering waterfalls, walk through a primeval rainforest, ride a white-knuckle railway and zip into the hinterlands

to observe indigenous wildlife in a 4-wheel-drive vehicle designed for adventure. How fitting that Charles Darwin stayed in the 1832 Heritage Homestead where you will stargaze. A private helicopter ride over the surrounding national park ensures yet another lasting memory.



AUSTRALIA'S WILD WONDERS

3 NIGHTS | 25 FEBRUARY 2024 BRISBANE TO CAIRNS


You can't help but feel at one with nature on this adventure, especially when observing its wonders up close with Aboriginal guides. Walk through a remote river gorge in the Daintree Rainforest and hear Dreamtime stories about the Earth's creation. Snorkel the Great Barrier Reef around Lady Elliot Island, a protected Green Zone teeming with manta rays and sea turtles. View other wildlife in less challenging ways by browsing the Cairns Aquarium and a wildlife habitat full of koalas, kangaroos and cassowaries. The opportunities are plentiful.



WINE COUNTRY & **DESERT DELIGHTS**

3 NIGHTS | 25 FEBRUARY 2024 **BRISBANE** TO CAIRNS

Opposites attract. Imagine spending the morning at a koala sanctuary and the evening enjoying tastings at an oasis-like winery. Alluring, yes? The North Territory's desert yields even more contrasting experiences. Delight in a pyrotechnic sunrise over Uluru, a monolithic rock that becomes a silhouette at night as 50,000 coloured lights illuminate the surrounding terrain. This is Aboriginal land, a fact that becomes wonderfully evident as you examine ancient rock art, learn about bush tucker foods and explore Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park, the ancestral land of the indigenous Anangu.



KOALAS, ULURU & THE KUKU YALANJI


3 NIGHTS | 25 FEBRUARY 2024 **BRISBANE** TO CAIRNS

No stone is left unturned on this exploration, including monolithic Ayers Rock, which the Aboriginals hold sacred and call Uluru. Watch it change colours at sunrise. Walk in its shadow while viewing the ancient rock art that the Anangu people created there. Behold Uluru looming in the distance during a magical evening light show as 50,000 bulbs illuminate the landscape. Port Douglas also beckons with the irresistible lure of seeing koalas in a wildlife habitat and walking through a rainforest with an indigenous Kuku Yalanji guide.

JOYOUS JAVA

2 NIGHTS | 9 MARCH 2024 BENOA TO SURABAYA

Become immersed in Java's history and culture through experiences that divulge the island's true nature. The impact of Hinduism and Buddhism comes to light at the temple complexes of Prambanan and Borobudur, respectively. Both architectural treasures are enlightening UNESCO World Heritage sites. A rare opportunity to watch a revered, almost spiritual kris dagger being made sheds additional light on the Javanese way of life. A train ride from the royal city of Yogyakarta brings you to sprawling Surabaya, where Arabic Square reveals the roots of Islam in Indonesia.



ARMIES OF THE FIRST EMPEROR

2 NIGHTS | 4 APRIL 2024 SHANGHAI TO XIAMEN

Browse the Terracotta Warriors Museum in Xian. a repository for thousands of excavated life-size clay soldiers and horses that once guarded the nearby tomb of China's first emperor. Incredibly, each figure was created individually with unique characteristics, grouped by battle order, armed with weapons and then covered with earth to protect the deceased Emperor Qin. Other highlights in Xian include the monumental ancient wall that stretches around the old city and the Big Wild Goose Pagoda, a Buddhist landmark founded in the 7th century.

THE GREAT WALL & FORBIDDEN CITY

2 NIGHTS | 4 APRIL 2024 SHANGHAI TO XIAMEN

Discover an array of signature attractions that shed light on China's historical and cultural importance. Bring your bucket list, as you will be checking off one landmark after another. Walk along one of the most famous passes of the Great Wall of China, which spans Juyong Pass and has long been a military stronghold. Also explore Beijing's Temple of Heaven and the fortified Forbidden City that served as China's imperial palace for nearly five centuries.

ANCIENT CAPITALS OF CHINA

3 NIGHTS | 4 APRIL 2024 SHANGHAI TO HONG KONG

China's glorious history rushes to the forefront through legendary landmarks, none more iconic than the Great Wall. Walking the section that spans rugged Juyong Pass presents panoramic views and highlights the wall's monumental construction. Beijing's imperial Temple of Heaven and Forbidden City are architectural wonders as well and recognised as UNESCO World Heritage sites. A view of ancient royal life is revealed at the Terracotta Warriors Museum in Xian, which holds thousands of life-size clay soldiers and horses found in the burial complex of China's first emperor.

HANOI EXPERIENCE

1 NIGHT | 10 APRIL 2024 HANOI


This definitive look at Hanoi presents attractions ranging from the city's oldest Buddhist shrine to the Hanoi Hilton, where American POWs were held during the Vietnam War. The Temple of Literature, which was constructed as a university in 1070 to honour Confucius, and lakefront Ngoc Son, a temple commemorating a 13th-century military hero, add deeper historical insight. Much of the second

day is devoted to Ho Chi Minh, Vietnam's former president. His mausoleum and the stilt house where he lived until his death are particularly illuminating.

VIETNAM & ANGKOR WAT MEDLEY

3 NIGHTS | 12 APRIL 2024 CHAN MAY TO HO CHI MINH CITY

Time travel isn't just for science fiction, as this adventure bridges the centuries. Discover why the ancient port of Hoi An earned a UNESCO World Heritage site designation. See another side of Vietnam in Da Nang's Cham Museum, home to the world's largest collection of sculptures that the Cham people created starting in the 4th century. Cambodia's Angkor Archaeological Park showcases the powerful Khmer Empire through the massive Buddhist temple Angkor Wat, the oversized stone faces at Angkor Thom and the tree-strangled ruins of the 12th-century temple Ta Prohm.






VIETNAM VIGNETTES

2 NIGHTS | 14 APRIL 2024 NHA TRANG TO HO CHI MINH CITY

Experience the true Vietnam in a multitude of ways and places. Reflect upon the influences of Hinduism and Buddhism at the Ponagar Tower complex in Nha Trang. Visit the former Presidential Palace where the fall of Saigon climaxed so infamously in 1975, and watch artisans create lacquerware treasures elsewhere in Ho Chi Minh City. Spend leisure time as you please at a riverside resort in the Mekong Delta, and then rise with the sun to cruise the labyrinthine waterways that lead to the iconic Cai Be Floating Market.



ANCIENT LUANG PRABANG


2 NIGHTS | 16 APRIL 2024 HO CHI MINH CITY TO BANGKOK

The limelight shines solely on Luang Prabang on this rare, in-depth exploration of Laos' ancient capital. Each moment, regardless of the hour, is maximised. Rise at dawn to watch hundreds of orange-robed monks collect alms from the faithful. See a pyrotechnic sunset over the serpentine Mekong River as a prelude to strolling through the atmospheric night market. Contemplate the essence of Buddhism at Wat Mai and the beauty of nature at Kuang Si waterfall. Delve into Laotian history at the National Museum that occupies the former royal palace.



2 NIGHTS | 16 APRIL 2024 HO CHI MINH CITY TO BANGKOK


So spectacular that it deserves your full attention, the Angkor Archaeological Park is a UNESCO World Heritage site of extraordinary cultural and symbolic importance. Water from annual monsoons dictated its rise and eventual collapse in the 15th century, which becomes evident by exploring the ruins, especially at the massive religious monument Angkor Wat deep in the Cambodian jungle. Similarly, the enormous stone faces at Angkor Thom and the fig tree-choked temples at Ta Prohm reveal other aspects of the ancient Khmer kingdom.



KHMER KALEIDOSCOPE & ANGKOR WAT

3 NIGHTS | 19 APRIL 2024 BANGKOK TO SINGAPORE

A study in contrasts, this experience presents the horrors of the Khmer Rouge regime of the 1970s juxtaposed with the glorious Buddhist temple complex Angkor Wat. See the infamous Killing Fields and a museum that chronicles the genocide of that time period. The glories of Khmer architecture take centre stage at the Royal Palace and the extravagant Silver Pagoda. Still, Angkor Wat is undeniably the highlight as this UNESCO World Heritage site was the centre of the Khmer kingdom in the 9th through 15th centuries.

The gold-plated Shwezigon Pagoda is an architectural gem so stunning that its design became the prototype for thousands of pagodas that followed. Bagan is also renowned for exquisite lacquerware and watching artisans create it using traditional methods is an eye-opener.

AUTHENTIC INLE LAKE

1 NIGHT | 28 APRIL 2024 YANGON


Marvel at the extraordinary while cruising beautiful Inle Lake, which nestles between two mountain ranges in Myanmar. Curiosities along the way include a Buddhist temple whose monks have trained cats to jump through hoops and a pagoda with Buddha statues covered with so much gold that it obscures their original forms. Even the fishermen are unconventional, as they row with one leg to keep their hands free to manage their cone-shaped nets. Enjoy memorable encounters with residents belonging to the Intha tribe at a floating market.

TAJ MAHAL: THE ETERNAL MASTERPIECE

3 NIGHTS | 4 MAY 2024 COCHIN TO MUMBAI

Surrender to the mesmerising Taj Mahal, a symbol of eternal love and architectural splendour whose appearance changes chameleon-like as the day unfolds. Pale pink at dawn, it may look translucent blue at dusk when you gaze upon it again. Between visits, explore the wonders of the former Mughal

Empire. Options include the fanciful imperial city within Agra Fort, the Mughal capital Fatehpur Sikri and a mausoleum that inspired the Taj Mahal's design. A delightful day in Delhi, shopping in Agra and a private astrological consultation add cultural texture.



HIMALAYAN KINDGOM OF NEPAL

TIGERS & THE PINK CITY


3 NIGHTS | 4 MAY 2024 **COCHIN TO MUMBAI**

First painted pink in 1876 as a sign of hospitality, Jaipur still delights with architectural treasures such as Amber Fort and its royal observatory, both extraordinary UNESCO World Heritage sites. Safari-style game drives through Ranthambore's jungles and gorges present wonders of a different stripe as you may observe Bengal tigers, sloth bears and sambar, India's largest native deer.

AJANTA & ELLORA CAVES

3 NIGHTS | 5 MAY 2024 MANGALORE TO MUMBAI

Explore two UNESCO World Heritage site cave complexes, both hand-cut from solid rock to create religious sanctuaries. The 2nd-century-BC Ajanta Caves contain arguably the world's most important Buddhist wall paintings. The colours are still vibrant, thanks to an infrared restoration process that removed centuries of grime. The Ellora Caves are noteworthy because their stone sanctuaries are devoted to Buddhism, Hinduism and Jainism, a clear illustration of ancient India's religious tolerance. The enormous, heavily ornamented Kailasa temple there was carved from a single block of stone.



LUXOR & THE PYRAMIDS

1 NIGHT | 24 MAY 2024 **SAFAGA**

If the temples and tombs in the Valley of the Kings aren't enough to bedazzle your inner Egyptologist, the treasures awaiting in Cairo will be the tipping point. See monumental Luxor Temple, another temple that the only female pharaoh built and the Colossi of Memnon that stands sentinel over the valley's sprawling necropolis. Priceless relics found in the tombs are displayed in Cairo's Egyptian Museum of Antiquities. The Pyramids of Giza and the Great Sphinx make quite the finale.

THE JEWELS OF LUXOR

1 NIGHT | 24 MAY 2024 SAFAGA

Explore a litany of fabled tombs in ancient Egypt's royal burial grounds, beginning with the Karnak and Luxor temples, which a two-mile avenue lined with small sphinxes once connected. King Tut's tomb still remains the most famous, as it held fabulous riches when excavated. His mummy is displayed there in a climate-controlled glass box. Queen Nefertari's tomb nearby is renowned for its colourful wall paintings that have defied the ravages of time. Cruising the Nile in a traditional dahabeya boat allows time to reflect on the sights.
