EXPEDITION 101

all you need to know

Spontaneous and surprising. Remote and rugged. Always revealing and immensely rewarding. Expedition cruising is very different from traditional Ocean cruising, and here we share a primer to provide insight into the important nuances of this bold manner of exploratory travel.



WHAT IS EXPEDITION CRUISING?

By its very nature, expedition cruising is designed to be flexible, allowing for spontaneous discovery as wildlife sightings and natural wonders present themselves. It is important to note that all aspects of an itinerary — voyage highlights, scheduled ports of call, potential Zodiac landings, and day-to-day activities — are entirely dependent on weather and ship's logistics. This is especially true when exploring polar regions, as ice conditions and weather ultimately dictate what can and cannot be done.

EXPEDITION TEAM

With experience tailored to regions explored — polar, tropical, cultural — our Expedition Team works closely with the Captain and bridge officers to spot wildlife and identify wilderness opportunities. Itineraries may be deliberately altered to linger longer in a destination on one day — perhaps to snorkel with a playful pod of dolphins or observe a raft of penguins on an ice floe — which in turn may affect plans for the next day. On every voyage, the overarching goal is to create the most meaningful guest experience.

ZODIACS & LANDINGS

Due to the remoteness of many destinations, much of our discovery will be done via Zodiacs. These sturdy inflatable rubber vessels are very safe and widely used throughout the world in polar, tropical and scientific expeditions. Additionally, several locations have limited docking facilities — and some, such as the polar regions and deep tropical archipelagos, have none — and the ship's Zodiacs are used to go ashore.

WILDLIFE

From penguins in Antarctica and polar bears in the Arctic to seals in Scotland and boobies in Perú, witnessing wildlife in its natural habitat is a key attraction of expedition cruising. And while the entire Expedition Team and ship's crew are vigilant with their efforts in spotting these opportunities, wildlife sightings cannot be guaranteed.

WHAT TO WEAR

Depending on the region explored, the weather on your expedition will either be cold, temperate or hot. Each itinerary features a comprehensive packing list along with what is included as part of your expedition cruise fare. Regardless of where your journey takes you, we recommend packing clothes that can be layered in natural, breathable fabrics of cotton (and/or wool), along with windproof and/or waterproof clothing and shoes. Onboard evening attire is significantly relaxed, with no formal evenings at all. Expedition gear is offered through our wilderness outfitter Ship to Shore and details may be viewed at:

HEALTH

Expedition cruising, especially to remote destinations, is intended for people in good health. In many of the regions explored, there are no sophisticated medical facilities. While *Crystal Endeavor* does have a full-time experienced doctor and nurse on board at all times, the ship's infirmary has basic medications and equipment. For landings, guests should be able to get in and out of a Zodiac and be confident on their feet.

ENRICHMENT & ENTERTAINMENT

On an expedition cruise, exploration, discovery and learning essentially become your entertainment. The public spaces aboard *Crystal Endeavor* are designed to showcase the world "outside" or "undersea" with state-of-the-art technologies and video screens, and comfortable lounges host expert-led conversational lectures.

ENVIRONMENT/SUSTAINABILITY

Standard operating procedures aboard *Crystal Endeavor* revolve around a core philosophy of efficiency and sustainability: from a fleetwide ban on plastic straws and minimizing single-use plastics to eco-friendly water filtration, state-of-the-art water treatment systems, exhaust emissions cleaned by a Selective Catalytic Reductant system, environmentally friendly lubricants and tributyl-free underwater paint. The ship is equipped to connect to shore power while in port and features fully integrated LED lighting, technology that automatically reduces heating and air conditioning when guests are not in suites and FarSounder underwater sonar.



ANTARCTIC PENINSULA

The White Continent is known to be the coldest, windiest and yes, the driest place on Earth. It is the largest and highest continent, 99 percent of it covered by a spectacular ice sheet. Wildlife lives only along its coasts, much of it concentrated on the Antarctic Peninsula, the continent's northernmost arc of snow-capped mountains and ice-covered islands.

THE FALKLAND ISLANDS

About 350 miles east of Patagonia, this fascinating archipelago of 700+ islands boasts phenomenal scenery, iconic sheep farms and abundant wildlife, from sea lions to elephant seals. But it's the birdlife that remains extraordinary — some 65 species make their home here, including five different kinds of penguins and the world's largest albatross colony.

SHETLAND ISLANDS

Just northwest of the Antarctic Peninsula, the icebergs and snow-capped mountains of this volcanic archipelago are a mesmerizing sight. A haven for wildlife, colonies of chinstrap, gentoo and Adélie penguins live here, as do Antarctic fur seals and Southern elephant seals. Seabirds are everywhere, including Antarctic terns and giant petrels.

SOUTH GEORGIA

These glacier-clad, sub-Antarctic isles are known as the Serengeti of the Southern Ocean and are accessible only by sea. Spectacularly picturesque and steeped in the expedition history of Sir Ernest Shackleton — his final resting place is here — South Georgia is home to an awe-inspiring colony of king penguins (thousands!), Antarctic fur seals and more.

DAY 1 | USHUAIA, ARGENTINA

Your expedition begins in Ushuaia, the world’s southernmost city on the island of Tierra del Fuego. While Ferdinand Magellan was exploring the straits between the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans in 1520, he was amazed by the smoke and fires which seemed to appear at every turn. These fires, kept continuously alight by the Yaghan and Ona Indians, became the inspiration for the name “Tierra del Fuego,” Land of Fire.

DAY 2 | CROSSING THE DRAKE PASSAGE

This 600-mile-wide body of water between South America’s Cape Horn and the Antarctic Peninsula is where the Atlantic, Pacific and Southern oceans converge, and where unimpeded westerly winds aid the flow of the Antarctic Circumpolar Current — a huge volume of water about 600 times the flow of the Amazon River. Seabirds, notably wandering, royal and light mantled sooty albatross, as well as southern giant petrels, follow ships making the crossing and whales might also be seen.

DAY 3 | SOUTH SHETLAND ISLANDS, ANTARCTICA

About 75 miles north of the Antarctic Peninsula lie the South Shetland Islands, a chain of windswept volcanic isles covered in ice save for their coastal shores where gentoo, Adélie and chinstrap penguins are known to visit along with Weddell and fur seals, southern giant petrels, Antarctic terns, kelp gulls and skuas. The surrounding krill-rich waters often attract whales and the islands themselves are home to Antarctica’s greatest biological diversity.

DAYS 4 - 9
 ANTARCTIC PENINSULA EXPEDITION STOPS

Extending from the northernmost reaches of the Antarctic mainland, this 800-mile-long mountain range of ice and islands jutting into the Weddell Sea is the Antarctica of dreams. The "circle" itself does not follow a strict line; in fact, depending on the axial tilt of Earth (the same thing that determines the seasons) which fluctuates within a margin of two degrees over a span of 40,000 years, the Antarctic Circle is moving southward at about 49 feet (14.93 M) per year.

THE FALKLAND ISLANDS

CAPE TOWN, SOUTH AFRICA

MAR 14 | TRISTAN DA CUNHA,
BRITISH OVERSEAS TERRITORY

Remote and ancient, this volcanic island in the South Atlantic is miles from nowhere (actually, it's an estimated 1,500 miles northwest of Cape Town). Discovered in 1502 by Portuguese Admiral João da Nova on his return voyage from India, it became a British dependency in 1834. An island of contrasts, it was soon known as a haven for sea travelers due to its luxuriant vegetation, equable climate, wealth of fruit trees and lush valleys.

MAR 15 | NIGHTINGALE ISLAND,
BRITISH OVERSEAS TERRITORY

Uninhabited but for the abundant seabird colonies that breed here, Nightingale Island is an active volcano that has long perplexed explorers. Its jagged coastline and "broken" peaks challenged the Dutch who first tried to anchor offshore, leaving the island largely to the birds for centuries. It is today the focus of extensive wildlife conservation efforts, home to yellow-nosed albatrosses, great shearwaters, and rockhopper penguins among the local residents of the four designated wetlands.

MAR 16 | GOUGH ISLAND,
BRITISH OVERSEAS TERRITORY

The only continual human presence found on these rugged shores is that of the annually rotating crew at the meteorological station. Beyond that, Gough Island, originally discovered in 1505 by Portuguese explorers, is a UNESCO World Heritage site and Important Bird Area home to hundreds of thousands of sea birds, including two endemic species. Sub-antarctic fur seals are known to breed here, too.



A large penguin colony makes a home on Halifax Island.

The beautiful tidal lagoon here is home to abundant birdlife, most notably the resident flamingos, as well as pelicans, herons and Damara terns. Dolphins, whales and Cape fur seals inhabit the plankton-rich waters around the Pelican Point Lighthouse, and on the eastern horizon, Dune 7 marks the start of the Namib Desert.

MAR 27 | LUANDA, ANGOLA

Luanda was originally the heart of Portuguese Angola in the 17th century, until the country gained its independence in 1975. The Fortaleza de São Miguel, built in 1576, offers views northward of the city’s waterfront, while Kissama National Park, about an hour south of Luanda, provides close-by wildlife viewing opportunities.

MAR 30 | SÃO TOMÉ, SÃO TOMÉ AND PRÍNCIPE

It’s a place of 16th century fortresses, a reviving cocoa (and artisan chocolate) trade, and vibrant reef diving in turquoise waters beyond the white sand beaches.



BOM BOM ISLAND, SÃO TOMÉ AND PRINCIPE

This nearly completely forested islet is part of the UNESCO-listed Island of Príncipe Biosphere Reserve. Tropical forests and marine ecosystems are home to remarkably diverse flora and fauna, making Bom Bom and its neighbors vital to the conservation of sea turtles, seabirds, cetaceans and coral reefs.

APR 2 | COTONOU, BENIN

Energetic and welcoming, Cotonou is the most westernized city in Benin, replete with the Grand Marché du Dantokpa brimming with artisans' wares and a lively restaurant scene. In fact, some of the most coveted experiences in the city's center are epicurean in nature, with a number of refined French eateries and terraced lounges offering flavor and hospitality.

APR 3 | LOMÉ, TOGO

The city center is a hub of cultural activity, from the region's heritage at the Museum of West African Art to the colorful, entrepreneurial Grand Marché, or market.

Flanked by fertile green hills, this is one of the most picturesque places in the Canary Islands, a Spanish-held archipelago wrought from volcanic activity. The old town showcases a Caribbean feel and color palette, and cobbled streets lead to a marketplace where equally colorful products are sold, including mangoes, papayas, passion fruit and sugar cane.

APR 24
PUERTO DE LA ESTACA, EL HIERRO, SPAIN

Once thought to be the end of the world, this westernmost isle of the Canaries is home to a UNESCO-listed biosphere reserve that seems far removed from the modern-day charms of the archipelago's other islands. Meadows of wildflowers, juniper groves and pine forests are dotted with natural pools and trails for wandering, while exceptional diving lies just beyond shore.

APR 25
SELVAGEM GRANDE, SAVAGE ISLANDS, PORTUGAL

More than 40,000 Cory's shearwater birds dominate this tiny speck on the map between the Madeira and Canary archipelagos, overwhelming the human population of precisely two: a guard of the Natural Reserve and a biologist who resides here to study the birds' behaviors. That's not to say it's a quiet, sleepy place. When the shearwaters are in residence, their calls can be heard from the Zodiacs by which you'll explore these shores.

APR 26 | SAFI, MOROCCO

The 16th-century Ksar El Bahr fortress presides over Safi, which is also home to the National Museum of Ceramics. Venture to Marrakesh to explore medieval history of the Berber Empire. Ancient artistry is everywhere here, in the Saadian Tombs, palaces, museums and souks.

APR 27 | CASABLANCA, MOROCCO

With visions of Bergman and Bogart filling the imagination, it's easy to explore the French-colonial design and narrow alleyways of the old Medina, and bargain-filled souks are reminders of mysterious days past. Today a gleaming city of modern design, broad palm-lined boulevards and attractive parks, Casablanca offers outdoor adventures, too.

APR 28 | MARBELLA (PUERTO BANÚS), SPAIN

Subtle it is not. The waterfront of Puerto Banús in Marbella is lined with lavish yachts while the evening avenues are illuminated by glitzy nightclubs and restaurants. Sunsets are spectacular, especially after a day spent exploring beyond the modern delights into the deep heritage of Romans, Phoenicians and Moors. Set against the Sierra Blanca mountains, the old town is a lovely contrast.





MAY 5 | CASCAIS, PORTUGAL

The tranquil fishing village heritage of this Portuguese Riviera harbor beautifully intermingles with its present, where posh resorts share coastal space with sites like Sintra Monserrate Palace and the ruins of Moors Castle. The hills of Serra de Sintra offer a rugged retreat from the hubbub of town, and sparkling golden bays are ideal for swimming.

MAY 5 - 6 | LISBON, PORTUGAL
OVERNIGHT

Discover the world's last colonial empire, turned bustling cosmopolitan city. With its dozens of Moorish castles, pastel buildings, and white sand beaches to explore, this welcoming city adorned with beautiful tilework perfectly encapsulates Mediterranean charm with its wine, food and architecture.

MAY 7 | VIANA DO CASTELO, PORTUGAL

The centerpiece of this hub of Rococo palaces is the Santa Luzia Sanctuary. Presiding atop its namesake hill, it sets the stage for discoveries of deep religious, artistic and architectural heritage. 

Floating between England and France, the Channel Islands chart their own geopolitical course. And Jersey's is especially scenic, with its rugged coastline and balmy Gulf Stream-kissed climate, shown off with green abandon at the Samarès Manor botanical garden.

For others, it's the works of legendary Dutch masters with names like Vermeer, Van Gogh and Rembrandt. Beyond the yachts, shops and cafés in Milford Haven, the UK’s National Trust protects birding hot-spot St. David’s Peninsula, the iconic coastline of Stackpole Estate, and Colby Woodland Garden with its formal walls and blooms from daffodils and hydrangeas to its signature rhododendrons.

MAY 29 | DUBLIN, IRELAND

The Irish capital enjoys one of Europe’s loveliest settings. Craggy Howth Head shelters the natural harbor at Dublin Bay and the gurgling River Liffey flows through the center of town. The city’s most pervasive influences come from the 18th and 19th centuries when elegant Georgian mansions were first built along the river.

MAY 30 | PORTRUSH, IRELAND

Northern Ireland’s Causeway Coast is renowned for its beautiful beaches, cliffs, forests and headlands. The Royal Portrush Championship Golf Course is a major draw for golfers, and the world’s oldest licensed whiskey distillery is nearby. Visit the UNESCO-listed Giant’s Causeway — legend holds that its unusual basalt columns are the handiwork of a giant.

MAY 31 | IONA ISLAND, SCOTLAND
& STAFFA, SCOTLAND

These tiny isles of the Inner Hebrides are rich in history and nature. Pastoral and windswept Iona is the final resting place for many Scottish kings; its abbey is an important sacred site. Staffa's impressive landscape of cliffs includes the famous cathedral-like Fingal's Cave. As early as late spring, waters attract dolphins, minke whales and cliff-nesting puffins.

JUN 1 | ST. KILDA, SCOTLAND
& FLANNAN ISLES, SCOTLAND

Both of these archipelagos are found in the Outer Hebrides. St. Kilda is the UK's only dual UNESCO World Heritage site, recognized for both its cultural heritage and marine environment — its spectacular cliffs make up Europe's most important seabird sanctuary, home to the world's largest colony of northern gannets. The Flannan Isles — the Seven Hunters — are popular for guillemots, gannets, fulmars and puffins.

JUN 2 | INVEREWE, SCOTLAND
& ULLAPOOL, SCOTLAND

Two gems in the Scottish Highlands: Inverewe Garden is renowned for its pre-historic Wollemi pines and towering California redwoods, its delicate flowers and subtropical plants (thanks to the Gulf Stream), and its wildlife from birds and deer to seals and otters. Ullapool's landscape of mountain and shore is ideal for hiking and kayaking, with other notable sites including Leckmelm's woodland garden, Castle Leod of the Mackenzie clan, and Gled Ord of Scotch Whiskey fame.

JUN 3 | KIRKWALL, ORKNEY ISLANDS, SCOTLAND

Home to 12th-century monuments including St. Magnus Cathedral and ruins of the Bishop's and Earl's Palace, Kirkwall is also the gateway to the UNESCO-listed Heart of Neolithic Orkney — an important living museum of prehistory settlement, ceremonial and burial sites.

JUN 4 - 5
ISLE OF NOSS, SHETLAND ISLANDS, SCOTLAND
& LERWICK, SHETLAND ISLANDS, SCOTLAND
OVERNIGHT

Nearly 50 miles north of the Orkneys, the Shetlands are a sub-Arctic archipelago of more than 100 islands. Towering sandstone cliffs line the Isle of Noss, where sheep and namesake ponies graze windblown, flower-strewn meadows, and the picturesque capital of Lerwick serves as a gateway to adventures of these islands that see thousands of fulmars, kittiwakes, gannets, puffins and fulmars descend on every nook and cranny on the cliffs during spring and summer.

JUN 5 | UNST, SHETLAND ISLANDS, SCOTLAND

Home to a host of "Britain's Most Northerly" attractions, from a castle and church to a gin distillery, this rugged isle boasts a landscape of massive cliffs, sea stacks and sheltered bays — an ideal habitat for such seabirds as puffins, fulmars, gulls, shags, gannets and kittiwakes.

JUN 6 | FAIR ISLE, SCOTLAND

Known for its namesake sweater still made in local workshops, the island is also a paradise for bird-watchers with its steep cliffs attracting an array of seabirds, including Atlantic puffins, storm petrels, black guillemots and Arctic terns.

JUN 7 - 8 | EDINBURGH (LEITH), SCOTLAND
OVERNIGHT

Dominated by a medieval castle on a towering crag, Edinburgh is the celebrated capital of Scotland and boasts more than a thousand years of vibrant historical heritage. The Exchange building, the famous Royal Mile featuring St. Giles Cathedral and John Knox House, as well as Palace of Holyroodhouse, the Queen's official residence in Scotland, are only a few of the architectural masterpieces found in this delightful Scottish city.

NORWAY

In a country known for its glacier-carved fjords — there are more than 1,000 — the UNESCO-listed West Norwegian Fjords earn every one of their superlatives: awe-inspiring, majestic, magnificent. The stunning Nærøyfjord is the world’s narrowest and home to Gudvangen, or “Palace of the Gods,” while 75 miles north, Geirangerfjord is celebrated for its pristine beauty and spectacular waterfalls. From tiny Flåm nestled in Sognefjord to the breathtaking Lofoten Islands, these forested landscapes, steep birding cliffs and nature reserves are home to puffins, reindeer and high adventure.

SVALBARD

Beyond 66.5° north, Svalbard awaits: land of the polar bear and home to extraordinary seabirds and wildlife. Few have ever been to this frozen tundra, a Norwegian archipelago of Arctic desert wilderness home to 29 protected natural areas including seven national parks, six nature reserves, 15 bird sanctuaries and one geotope (rock formations that serve as a window into Earth’s past). Repeated ice ages carved out the stunning fjords, valleys and mountains, and it is here, where glacial ice covers 60 percent of the landscape, that the Global Seed Vault is built into bedrock.

JUN 12 | BRØNNØYSUND, NORWAY & VEGA ISLAND, NORWAY

From tiny Brønnøysund, explore picturesque Torget Island, rich with fjords, mountains and waterfalls and visit the iconic Torghatten, a towering mountain marked by a hole through its center. Nearby, wildlands of the UNESCO-protected Vega Archipelago are home to more than 230 bird species.

JUN 13 | RØST, NORWAY & REINE, NORWAY

Here at the southerly reaches of the Lofoten Islands, our journey coincides with Røst’s annual puffin festival to honor the archipelago’s most renowned feathered friend. And with its breathtaking grandeur, Reine has been called the most beautiful place in the world. It is perhaps best observed from the summit of Reinebringen Mountain on the island of Moskenesøya, one of the Lofoten’s best hubs for hiking, biking and kayaking.

JUN 14 | REINE, NORWAY; LEKNES, NORWAY & CRUISING TROLLFJORD

Just over one mile long and incredibly narrow with an entrance of only 328 feet, Trollfjord enchants with its dramatic beauty, while Leknes itself is home to some of the most spectacular scenery in Norway. The surrounding mountains and Arctic peaks here are awe-inspiring, and the perfect setting for hiking, climbing or cycling.

JUN 15 | TROMSØ, NORWAY

Tromsø lies on a forest-covered island in a narrow waterway, hemmed in by steep mountains and connected to the mainland by a bridge. The imaginative Arctic Cathedral, the Polaria Centre and a scenic cable car ride are among its varied attractions.

JUN 16 | GJESVÆRSTAPPAN, NORWAY & SKARSVÅG, NORWAY

The picturesque reserve of Gjesværstappan captivates with its cluster of steep, grass-blanketed islands. Puffins, gannets, guillemots, white-tailed eagles and more are all drawn here to breed on the cliffs. Located just eight miles from the North Cape, Skarsvåg is home to Kirkeporten, a geological marvel that magnifies the midnight sun as it shines through a several meters-long fissure in the rocky cliff, creating breathtaking views and reflections.

JUN 17 | BEAR ISLAND, NORWAY

This southernmost island of the Svalbard archipelago lies between the North Cape and Spitsbergen. Despite its name, polar bears are not a common sight. Instead, the island's steep cliffs and sea stacks provide a habitat for an array of nesting seabirds, from fulmars to puffins and more.

JUN 18 - 21 | SOUTH SPITSBERGEN NATIONAL PARK EXPEDITION, SVALBARD

Svalbard's largest national park includes majestic mountains, glaciers and four separate bird sanctuaries. Eider ducks and barnacle geese breed here, and Svalbard reindeer and Arctic fox can often be seen.


DAY 2 - 11 | NORTHWEST SPITSBERGEN NATIONAL PARK EXPEDITION, SVALBARD

Explore a magnificent landscape of glaciers and fjords, islands and sounds, hot springs and old volcanoes. With several bird cliffs, colonies and sanctuaries, at least one-third of the park is declared an Important Bird Area, attracting barnacle and brent geese, common eiders, black guillemots and more. History lives on with remnants of whaling stations and 17th-century graves, while Monaco Glacier creaks and groans as it calves into the sea and Woodfjorden serves as a haul-out for walrus.

HINLOPEN STRAIT EXPEDITION, SVALBARD

On the eastern shores of Svalbard, the Hinlopen Strait cuts between the archipelago's two largest islands, Spitsbergen and Nordaustlandet. The pack ice here is known to be thick, and the keen eye might spot walrus, beluga whales, bearded and ring seals, and maybe even a polar bear. The vertical basalt cliffs at Alkefjellet are home to tens of thousands of Brünnich's guillemots, glaucous gulls and kittiwakes.

NORTHEAST SVALBARD NATURE RESERVE, SVALBARD

Covered by glaciers and lined with fjords, the reserve covers all of Nordaustlandet (the archipelago's second largest island) and several other islands including Kong Karls Land that serves as an important breeding ground for polar bears. Here is where walruses come to rest and Brünnich's guillemots are known to nest. Identified as an Important Bird Area, keep an eye out for Brent geese, Sabine's and ivory gulls nesting on steep cliffs. Animals here include the Arctic fox and Svalbard reindeer.

SOUTHEAST SVALBARD NATURE RESERVE, SVALBARD

With a whaling history dating to the 17th century, this area encompasses the islands of Barentsøya and Edgeøya. Noted for its wide plateau-shaped mountains and open valleys, its rich tundra is home to Svalbard reindeer and Arctic foxes. The area is considered an important resting place for walrus, and kittiwakes colonize the steep cliffs. It is also an Important Bird Area for red-throated divers, barnacle and brent geese, Arctic terns, purple sandpipers and glaucous gulls.

SOUTH SPITSBERGEN NATIONAL PARK, SVALBARD

Svalbard's largest national park includes majestic mountains, glaciers and four separate bird sanctuaries located off the southern and western coasts: Sørkapp, Dunøyane, Isøyene, and Olsholmen. Eider ducks and barnacle geese breed and nest here, both on bird cliffs and on islands and islets. Look for Svalbard reindeer and Arctic fox, too.

NORTH ISFJORDEN NATIONAL PARK EXPEDITION, SVALBARD

Exploring Svalbard's second longest fjord is a dream come true for both nature and birding enthusiasts. Witness the dramatic wonder of glaciers calving into fjords where ringed seals are known to swim and play. And look to the steep cliffs to see all kinds of birds, from Brünnich's guillemots, little auks and Atlantic puffins to black-legged kittiwakes and pink-footed geese.

JUL 24 | CRUISING THE GREENLAND SEA

JUL 25 | HÚSAVÍK, ICELAND

Known as Iceland's whale-watching capital, some 23 species frequent sparkling Skjálfandi Bay — among them humpbacks, seis and blues. Nearby Lake Mývatn is alive with geothermal oddities and huge platoons of birdlife, and the Goðafoss Waterfall is another stunner.

JUL 25 | AKUREYRI, ICELAND

On a magnificent fjord bounded by snow-capped mountains and sloping pastures, Akureyri's weather is surprisingly moderate despite being just 60 miles from the Arctic Circle. Charming and historical, here you'll find over 2,000 species of plants in the Botanical Gardens, which thrive without the benefit of a greenhouse.

JUL 26 | ISAFJORDUR, ICELAND

Ringed by dramatic mountains in the Westfjords, this old trading post's as remote as they come — yet boasts a trending arts scene. Discoveries further afield might include Icelandic waterfalls, hiking and biking trails, bird-watching, a pint-sized botanic garden in the tundra, and tiny villages dwarfed by their surrounding peaks.

JUL 26 | VIGUR, ICELAND

This barely-populated Westfjords islet is a floating nature preserve where the locals harvest eiderdown for a living and upwards of 8,000 puffins nest in comical profusion. Enjoy a rare chance to observe these endearing creatures in their native environment, along with plenty of their avian brethren including eider ducks, black guillemots and swooping arctic terns.

JUL 27 - 28 | REYKJAVÍK, ICELAND OVERNIGHT

Isolated in a northern landscape of icy tranquility, Iceland is a land of volcanoes, hot springs, mountains, glaciers and northern lights. As the capital of Iceland, Reykjavík reflects this natural diversity with ancient maritime history as well as a thriving modern energy and sophistication.

ICELAND

DAY 1 - 2 | REYKJAVÍK, ICELAND
 OVERNIGHT

Isolated in a northern landscape of icy tranquility, Iceland is a land of volcanoes, hot springs, mountains and glaciers. Its capital of Reykjavík reflects this natural diversity with maritime history and modern sophistication. It’s also a gateway to the famed Blue Lagoon.

DAY 3 | FLATEY ISLAND, ICELAND

Largest of a constellation of pint-sized islands in Breiðafjörður Bay, birding in Flatey Island is topnotch, and a Zodiac spin in these waters is sure to yield rewarding sights.

DAY 3 | LÁTRABJARG CLIFFS, ICELAND

The crags of this rugged Westfjords promontory — Europe’s largest bird cliff — provide a perfect breeding environment for puffins, gannets, guillemots and razorbills.

DAY 3 | PATREKSFJÖRÐUR, ICELAND

Located across the inlet from the Látrabjarg Cliffs, enjoy spectacular views of the area’s avian residents. Nearby Rauðasandur beach is unique with its pinkish-red sands contrasting with the black cliffs and blue waters.

DAY 4 | DYNJANDI WATERFALL, ICELAND

The seven spectacular falls here sound like thunder as glacier-melt waters flow to the sea. Explore Arnarfjörður fjord and take a Zodiac to a remote landing spot.

DAY 4 | VIGUR ISLAND, ICELAND

This barely-populated Westfjords islet is a floating nature preserve where the locals harvest eiderdown for a living and upwards of 8,000 puffins nest in comical profusion.

DAY 5 | SIGLUFJÖRÐUR, ICELAND

Iceland’s northernmost town is the Atlantic’s undisputed herring capital — and something of an Icelandic folk music mecca with its own tasty craft brewery, too.

DAY 5-6 | AKUREYRI, ICELAND
 OVERNIGHT

On a magnificent fjord bounded by snow-capped mountains and sloping pastures, Akureyri’s weather is surprisingly moderate despite being just 60 miles from the Arctic Circle. Charming and historical, here you’ll find over 2,000 species of plants in the Botanical Gardens, which thrive without the benefit of a greenhouse.

DAY 6 | CROSSING THE ARCTIC CIRCLE

DAY 6 | HÚSAVÍK, ICELAND & GRÍMSEY ISLAND

Nature is boss here, and local fishermen must heed her clock and moods, which can be wild indeed. A hike across green tundra and coastal bluffs crosses terrain where vast numbers of seabirds flourish, including kittiwakes, endearing puffins and the rare dovekie, or ‘Little Auk,’ decked out in formal black and white plumage.

DAY 7 | VOPNAFJÖRÐUR, ICELAND

Relaxed geothermal soaking, brisk trekking, birdwatching and epic fishing are some of the key attractions here, as are monumental rock pillars strewn along the coast.

DAY 7 | HAFNARHOLMI, ICELAND

Even in a country known for its prime puffin-spotting locales, this spot is a special sight. A special boardwalk brings you close to these famously clownlike red-footed birds and loads of other seabirds also feel at home in this stark landscape including Arctic terns, known for boisterously protecting their nests.

DAY 8 | SEYÐISFJÖRÐUR, ICELAND

Tucked deep inside a mountain-walled fjord, this town is home to bright wooden houses, reindeer, seals, snow-dusted peaks and cascading waterfalls, even a vibrant arts scene. Enjoy outdoor adventures from hiking the Skálanes Nature Reserve to floating in geothermal pools.

DAY 8 | HEIMAÆY, VESTMANNAEYJAR, ICELAND & CRUISING SURTSEY ISLAND

The main island of an otherworldly archipelago, Heimaey endured a 1973 volcanic eruption so violent the whole population fled to the mainland — a cataclysm well-chronicled at Eldheimar Museum. A who’s who of seabirds and a beluga whale sanctuary are other highlights, while a neighboring isle may be the youngest place on earth: UNESCO-listed Surtsey Island, born by underwater eruption in 1963.

DAY 8 | REYJAVÍK, ICELAND

After exploring the wild and wondrous treasures of Iceland, return to Reyjavík to prepare for your journey home, filled with memories of a lifetime. But before you go, you might want to savor the city’s buzzy culinary scene, too.

Vibrantly painted houses dot the harbor of this picturesque colonial town. Discover quaint squares, the “Stone and Man” sculpture park, and Norseman history at the Qaqortoq Museum.

AUG 27-28 | IGALIKU, GREENLAND
& NARSARSUAQ, GREENLAND

A rolling valley lush with flora, tall snow-covered mountains, and a swath of sandstone houses frame the backdrop of Igaliku, Greenland’s oldest sheep farming settlement. Hiking trails lead to Qooroq icefjord, farm visits, and the old Episcopal residence with its one-thousand-year-old irrigation system, still in use today. In Narsarsuaq, discover the history of Erik the Red and Viking settlers. Adventure awaits amidst the turquoise icebergs and the verdant Valley of Flowers that give way to the Greenland ice sheet.

AUG 29 | KANGILINNGUIT, GREENLAND

A collection of colorful houses lines the rocky terrain along the water’s edge of this modest settlement at the mouth of Arsuk Fjord. It is from here that Greenland’s only asphalted road leads to Ivittuut.

AUG 30-31 | NUUK, GREENLAND
& CRUISING NUUK FJORD

Centered amid scenic landscapes capped by mountains, this capital city is where age-old traditions, a colonial harbor, edgy architecture, haute cuisine, and diverse peoples live in harmony. It’s just as enjoyable to stroll the colonial harbor and ascend to the lookout for captivating sunset views over Myggedalen as it is to shop the boutiques, sample a strong coffee, visit the Nuuk Art Museum, or settle into a local drinking hole for a craft beer along Imaneq Street.







OCT 3 | GREAT INAGUA ISLAND, BAHAMAS

In the southern Bahamas, Inagua is comprised of two islands. Great Inagua is a hot spot for birdwatchers — the Inagua National Park spans nearly half of the island, home to more than 80,000 West Indian flamingos as well as Bahama parrots, Inagua woodstars and more. Little Inagua is a protected habitat for endangered sea turtles.

OCT 4 | PORT ANTONIO, JAMAICA

The New York Times once described this haven as “Jamaica unplugged.” One of the island’s lesser visited ports, its dreamy landscape of gorgeous beaches, misty mountains and waterfalls is truly enchanting, as are the sapphire waters of its famed Blue Lagoon.

At more than 100 years old, this marvel of mankind captivates with its intricate lock system lifting ships up 85 feet to the elevation of the Panama Canal, and lowering it with gentle ease.

OCT 9 | PANAMA CITY, PANAMA

Situated at the narrowest point in the Americas, the UNESCO-designated Casco Viejo has been revitalized with trendy new cafés, bars and shops. And yet, mere miles from the international fusion of Panama City’s colonial architecture and waterfront steel high-rises you’ll find one of the wildest rainforests in the Western Hemisphere, the Darién Jungle.



OCT 12
ENSENADA DE UTRÍA NATIONAL PARK, COLOMBIA

The dramatic mountain rainforests and rich marine environment here showcase some of Colombia's most magnificent natural resources. Verdant and humid with some of the highest rainfall in the world, the protected forest is home to vast and varied wildlife while waters are inhabited by sea turtles, dolphins, whales and over 180 species of fish.

OCT 13 | GORGONA ISLAND, COLOMBIA

The lush flora and fauna of this national park have consumed the ruins of a former prison once located here. The ecosystem supports a diversity of wildlife, including the blue anole, the world's bluest lizard. The island is popular with whale watchers from June through October, when humpback whales arrive for the breeding season.

OCT 14 | ISLA DE LA PLATA, ECUADOR

Part of the Machalilla National Park, this tiny, uninhabited isle translates to "Island of Silver;" legend holds Sir Francis Drake buried his pirate's bounty here. Its rugged landscape of beaches, sheer clifftops and shrubland are home to blue-footed boobies and other wildlife often found on the more famous Galápagos Islands.

OCT 15 | LOBOS DE TIERRA, PERÚ

Set within the protected Guano Islands — a collection of islets and capes tentatively listed for UNESCO inclusion — this rocky and virtually barren landscape about 12 miles off the coast of Perú was once a major guano mining center. Today it is known for the thousands of seabirds that flock to its windswept shores to breed. These include guanay cormorants, kelp gulls, Peruvian pelicans, and three species of boobies.

OCT 16-17 | SALAVERRY, PERÚ
OVERNIGHT

The port of Salaverry leads the way to Trujillo, Perú's second largest city. The area is an archaeological treasure trove thanks to two pre-Inca civilizations: the Mochicas, who erected two pyramids, the Sun Temple and the Moon Temple; and the Chimú, whose adobe city of Chan Chan is now excavated. Later occupied by Spanish conquistadors in the 16th century, the colonial flavor of Trujillo is still very much evident in the architecture of its old churches and historic mansions.

OCT 17 | ISLAS GUAÑAPE, PERÚ

Today protected by Perú's National Reserve System of Guano Islands, Isles and Capes, these uninhabited islands were long exploited for their bounty of bird droppings, which can be used as an agricultural fertilizer. Thousands of seabirds, including blue-footed boobies, Inca terns and Peruvian pelicans, make their home here.

OCT 18-19 | LIMA/CALLAO, PERÚ

Lima is called the City of Kings, but a more appropriate nickname might be the City of Museums — there are over 20 here, and Lima's streets are something of a museum in and of themselves. Mansions in the colonial district are adorned by ornate balconies. Churches are gorgeous and historic. OCT 22 | MATARANI, PERÚ

Gateway to Arequipa, known as the White City owing to the white volcanic rock used in its buildings, Matarani sits 7,661 feet above sea level, surrounded by a dramatic volcano. The city boasts a UNESCO-listed historical center with an impressive cathedral. The nearby Mejia Lagoons National Sanctuary hosts hundreds of species of birds.

OCT 23 | ARICA, CHILE

Nestled among coast, Atacama Desert and a high Andean plateau, Arica is known as the City of Eternal Spring. Inhabited for the past 10,000 years, it boasts the Gustave Eiffel-designed San Marco Cathedral, and the Morro de Arica, a historic 450-foot hill offering stunning views.

OCT 24 | IQUIQUE, CHILE

Iquique looks a bit like an American Old-West town... with a South American address. A history of mining and pedestrian area with wooden sidewalks evoke images of cowboys and gold mines. The Georgian and Victorian architecture, duty-free shopping, and wide swaths of beach make this one of Chile's premiere beach resorts.

OCT 25 | ANTOFAGASTA, CHILE

Sandwiched between ocean, desert and mountains, Antofagasta captivates with a lovely climate and an eclectic culinary and cultural scene. View Mother Nature's spectacular handiwork, the rocky offshore archway known as La Portada, or peer at the stars from world-famous Paranal Observatory. See the massive Mano del Desierto (Hand of the Desert) sculpture or stroll the golden sands of Playa Paraíso.

OCT 26 | PAN DE AZÚCAR, CHILE

The national park here is graced with more than 100,000 acres of beaches and cactus-spangled hills. Its centerpiece is tiny Isla Pan de Azúcar. Thousands of Humboldt penguins call its rocky shores home, along with an array of other wildlife, including Peruvian pelicans and South American marine otters.

OCT 27 | ISLOTES PÁJAROS, CHILE

The two tiny islets known as Islotes Pájaros Grande and Chico sit in the shimmering waters just off the Chilean coast of Caleta Hornos, a town in the commune of La Higuera. Their rugged shores host a wealth of seabirds, including Peruvian boobies, red-legged cormorants and Humboldt penguins. The islets also attract sea lions.

OCT 28 | SAN ANTONIO, CHILE

Set within seaside hills with views of the harbor and ocean, San Antonio boasts a Mediterranean climate — the perfect spot to enjoy a meal of local fish and Chardonnay, take a picturesque stroll along "Paseo Bellamar," or enjoy stunning vistas from the hilltop "Cristo del Maipo" statue.

OCT 29 | CRUISING THE COAST OF CHILE

OCT 30 | ISLA MOCHA, CHILE

The wild native forests and golden-sand beaches here are a paradise for hikers, divers and nature lovers. Almost half of the island is devoted to the pristine Mocha Island National Reserve. 



NOV 7 | PUNTA ARENAS, CHILE

As the only city situated on the Strait of Magellan, a 300-mile waterway dissecting the mainland and the island of Tierra del Fuego, Punta Arenas (Sandy Point) is also the bustling center of one of the world's largest sheep farming areas, and gateway to explorations deep into Patagonia's frontier regions.

NOV 8 | CRUISING AINSWORTH BAY & MARINELLI GLACIER

Within Tierra del Fuego's protected Alberto de Agostini National Park region, southern elephant seals, whales, dolphins, Magellanic penguins and a variety of seabirds make their home in the icy waters fed by the beautiful Darwin Mountain Range ice field.

NOV 8 | SCENIC CRUISING GABRIEL CHANNEL

NOV 9 | CRUISING GARIBALDI FJORD & GLACIER

Garibaldi Glacier is impressive, home to a tranquil forest and glacial waterfall... also with views of the Darwin Range of mountains rising out of the fjords.

NOV 9 | CRUISING THE BEAGLE CHANNEL

In the heart of Patagonia, this monumental glacial region also known as Glacier Alley is among the most magnificent frozen sites on Earth.

NOV 10 | DIEGO RAMÍREZ, CHILE

About 60 miles southwest of Cape Horn is a small group of Chilean islands known as Islas Diego Ramírez, home to millions of breeding seabirds, including albatrosses, petrels, shearwaters and rockhopper penguins.

NOV 10 | CRUISING CAPE HORN


Before the Panama Canal, it was around this cape at the southernmost tip of South America that ships would navigate because the Strait of Magdalena often proved too narrow. Rounding Cape Horn in 1832 aboard the *H.M.S. Beagle* (for which the Patagonian channel would later be named) ultimately led Charles Darwin to the Galapagos.

NOV 11 - 12 | USHUAIA, ARGENTINA OVERNIGHT

While Ferdinand Magellan was exploring the straits between the Atlantic and Pacific oceans in 1520, he was amazed by the smoke and fires which seemed to appear at every turn. These fires, kept continuously alight by the Yaghan and Ona Indians, became the inspiration for the name "Tierra del Fuego," Land of Fire, the island on which we find Ushuaia.



BEFORE YOU SAIL



AIR TRANSPORTATION & LUGGAGE

Transfers, portorage and luggage handling are part of our optional Crystal Air/Sea Program. If you choose to arrange for air travel independently, you may request embarkation and disembarkation airport transfers from Crystal Expedition Cruises up to seven days prior to the cruise. Please be advised that all guests receive complimentary transfers between the airport and the ship on embarkation and disembarkation days only.

When making your own air arrangements, we recommend allowing a minimum of five hours between your flight arrival time and *Crystal Endeavor's* sailing time. Specific port and pier information and embarkation times are stated on your cruise ticket. For itineraries to remote destinations, we recommend arriving to embarkation city at least one day prior as once the ship departs there are no locations for guests or delayed baggage to meet the ship.

You must be on board *Crystal Endeavor* at least two hours prior to sailing. If *Crystal Endeavor* is scheduled to remain in port overnight or has a scheduled departure time after 9 pm, please plan to be at the pier no later than 7 pm for security clearance and check-in.

When planning your return flights, please take into consideration the date and time *Crystal Endeavor* is scheduled to dock at the final port. Customs and Immigration must conduct various inspections before you are allowed to disembark. Disembarkation usually starts around 8:30 am — differs by destination — and all guests must disembark by 10 am. Times may vary if *Crystal Endeavor* is in port where early morning flights are required. Before booking your departing flights, please also take into account the time needed at the airport for airline check-in and security procedures. Most airlines recommend you arrive no later than two-three hours prior to scheduled departure times. Some cities require a longer transfer time due to stringent Customs procedures or travel time to the airport. If you are making independent reservations to fly home directly after the cruise, you or your travel advisor should contact Crystal Reservations for flight departure guidelines, which vary by cruise itinerary and port.

Guests should contact the airlines directly to add frequent flyer numbers for mileage accrual, secure seat assignments, arrange for special service requirements and provide a personal phone contact for last-minute flight updates.

Details regarding checked and carry-on luggage allowances (restrictions, size, weight and quantity) and applicable fees, miscellaneous service airline fees or other flight-related inquiries should be discussed directly with the airlines or through your travel advisor. Flight schedules sometimes change. We strongly suggest that you reconfirm all flight numbers, flight times, check-in times, departure terminals and locations and seat assignments for both outbound and return flights 96 hours prior to departure.

BAGGAGE, VALUABLES & OTHER POSSESSIONS

Guests may bring aboard a reasonable amount of clothing and personal effects without charge, subject to airline restrictions. All baggage must be securely packed and distinctly labeled with the guest's full name, *Crystal Endeavor*, the suite number of the guest and the sailing date. Crystal strongly recommends that all luggage be locked.

Further, due to the differing local regulatory requirements and restrictions in destinations around the world regarding the use of aerial drones, and in the interest of maintaining a safe and secure environment for all guests and crew aboard all of our ships, please be advised that aerial drones are prohibited and may not be brought on board *Crystal Endeavor*. Drones must be surrendered to the Captain or onboard security officers at embarkation and will be kept in storage for the duration of the cruise.

Guests must personally carry baggage containing breakable items and valuables, including but not limited to jewelry, watches, money, precious stones and metals, medicine, electronics, securities, checks, documents, other financial instruments and/or tickets, at all times during transit, including but not limited to on and off *Crystal Endeavor*.

Guests should not give such baggage containing breakable items or valuables to anyone at any time, including but not limited to porters, onboard personnel or anyone else who is not known personally to the guest, regardless of any assurances given that it is safe to do so, including during transit to and from the airport, arrival at the expedition pier, boarding and checking into guest's suite or at any other time while traveling. Such baggage is always the full and sole personal responsibility of the guest and may not be included with checked baggage.

While in transit to and from *Crystal Endeavor* or when participating in a Crystal Destination Discoveries shore excursion, personal items and valuables such as jewelry, medication, tickets, passports and visas should be packed with your hand luggage and kept with you at all times.

Please Note: We highly recommend that you keep your carry-on luggage with you when in transit. Should you choose to check your carry-on luggage, Crystal cannot be held responsible for the luggage or the contents. Each suite is equipped with a personal safe.

LOST LUGGAGE

Please Note: When traveling to remote areas, lost luggage can create more than just an inconvenience. Due to the remoteness of some regions, lost luggage could be significantly delayed in catching up with the vessel. While these occurrences are rare, in the unlikely event that a guest does encounter the loss of a piece or pieces of luggage while in route to the ship, Crystal highly recommends that guests include essentials in their carry-on luggage such as a change of clothes, toiletries, medications and other necessary items which are deemed essential to minimize inconveniences while a guest is separated from their luggage. Please note that Crystal cannot be held responsible for any/all lost luggage.

BOARDING CRYSTAL ENDEAVOR

The exact embarkation and sailing times are specified on our cruise ticket but are subject to change without prior notice. All guests must carry a passport that is valid for six months after the end of the cruise in order to embark. At most embarkation ports, *Crystal Endeavor* is usually available for guests to board after noon (after being cleared by the local port authority). Suites are available for guests **only after 3 pm**.

On successive cruise days (the second cruise day through the last cruise day or night prior to disembarkation), all guests must be on board **no later than 60 minutes prior** to the scheduled departure.

When in port or during landings throughout a voyage, our unique computerized security system takes a reading of each guest's photo key card at the gangway to validate identity and advise the *Crystal Endeavor's* crew of each guest's onboard status.

Please note: To help ensure an efficient embarkation process, it is highly recommended that guests register their credit cards online at our Priority Check-in & Planning Center (PCPC) no later than seven days prior to the cruise.

If you have not registered your credit card prior to arrival, you will need to do so during embarkation. Registering your credit card provides you with the convenience of settling your onboard expenses using our Express Check-out System, ensuring a smooth and expeditious process at the conclusion of your cruise. You will receive an itemized statement delivered to your suite on the morning of disembarkation, and your credit card will be billed automatically through your credit card company. If you wish, at the conclusion of the cruise, you may elect to pay for your onboard expenses in cash or by check at the Reception Desk. If you decide to pay for your expenses by cash or check, please notify the Reception Desk and your credit card will not be charged.

Please note: Only U.S. dollars or personal checks drawn on U.S. bank accounts will be accepted.

CHILDREN ABOARD CRYSTAL ENDEAVOR

Any minor under the age of 18 must be accompanied by an adult over the age of 21. In addition, if the adult accompanying the child is not a parent or legal guardian, the "Parental Consent Guardianship Form" must be signed by a parent or legal guardian and received by Crystal Expedition Cruises no later than 30 days prior to sailing.

Guests age 11 and under at the time of sailing must be accompanied by an adult 21 or older in the same suite. Parents can have two related children booked in their own suite provided one of them is at least 16 years of age and traveling in an adjacent suite to parent/s or legal guardian/s, **excluding** Antarctic and Arctic expeditions. Infants six to 24 months of age may travel as a third berth in a suite. Crystal Expedition Cruises also reserves the right to restrict the number of passengers less than three years of age on board at any given time. If space allows, third-berth child rate will apply if accompanied by two full-fare adults.

Children occupying a double suite will be charged the adult rate regardless of age.

Crystal Expedition Cruises is unable to accommodate children less than six months of age as *Crystal Endeavor's* medical facilities are not designed to provide services to infants.

While children under the age of six years are welcome aboard *Crystal Endeavor*, there are no onboard programs for children and supervised care is not available. Additionally, *Crystal Endeavor* regularly uses Zodiacs — for discovery, landings and to escort guests ashore in destinations where the ship may be at anchor. **Children under six years of age are not allowed in Zodiacs and must remain on board under the supervision of a parent or guardian.**

ARCTIC & ANTARCTIC STIPULATIONS

Children under six years of age are not allowed on Arctic or Antarctic cruises. Pregnant women more than eight weeks pregnant may not sail on Arctic or Antarctic cruises. Service animals are not allowed on Antarctic cruises due to regulations and may be restricted in other ports, in which case, the guest must stay on board with their service animal. Disabled guests in wheelchairs, or those with specific conditions which demand special attention while traveling, are required to travel with a companion to assist the guests as staff, crew and fellow guests are not able to provide care for guests with medical conditions.

DOMESTIC

Please be advised that all guests receive complimentary transfers between the airport and the ship on embarkation and disembarkation days only.

At the airport upon arrival on embarkation day a Crystal representative will meet you in the baggage claim area. Please claim your luggage and leave both the luggage and claim checks with the representative. To reserve your transfer, log in to your reservation at the Priority Check-in and Planning Center (PCPC) or contact the Expedition Onboard Guest Services at OBGSYacht@crystalcruises.com

INTERNATIONAL

If you are arriving on an international flight, you will need to proceed through Immigration, claim your luggage and clear Customs prior to meeting your representative. You will then be escorted to the motor coach for the transfer service.

PASSPORTS & VISAS

PASSPORT

A passport valid for six months after the completion of the cruise is required for ALL guests. **Four blank visa pages are recommended per cruise for international voyages** (if you are traveling on two back-to-back voyages, you need eight blank visa pages). Guests must take full responsibility for securing the required travel documents prior to departure. **Failure to comply may result in refusal of passage by Customs and Immigration authorities.**

On most cruises, passports are collected and retained by *Crystal Endeavor's* staff for the duration of your voyage in order to facilitate official clearance in each port of call.

VISA REQUIREMENTS

Visa requirements vary from country to country. Crystal informs U.S. citizens of specific visa requirements. Visa information may also be obtained through the local embassy or consulate of the countries you will be visiting.

As requirements vary for each nationality, we request that all non-U.S. citizens contact their travel advisor or local authorities to determine their individual visa requirements for ALL ports. Failure to comply with requirements may result in refusal of passage. **It is your responsibility to obtain all necessary visas.** Visas must be obtained regardless of whether you plan to go ashore or remain on board while in ports that require visas.

Everyone must be cleared by local Immigration authorities upon arrival in port, regardless of the length of stay.

Please note: We recommend you contact your travel advisor to ensure you have secured all necessary visas and that all documentation is up to date. Crystal cannot be held responsible at the time of sailing for any visa information provided by us or your travel advisor, as visa rules and requirements change regularly.

PRIORITY CHECK-IN & PLANNING CENTER (PCPC)

Crystal's Priority Check-in & Planning Center (PCPC) is available online at checkin.crystalcruises.com for your convenience **until seven days prior to your cruise departure date**. Upon making your final cruise payment and once you have completed the initial online check-in process, we encourage you to use this center to pre-reserve specialty dining evenings, Crystal Life Spa appointments, Crystal Destination Discoveries Shore excursions, Creative Learning Institute® classes and more.

All reservations are subject to availability. Online reservations for shore excursions are available no earlier than one year prior to sailing.

In addition, Luggage Concierge is offered through a Crystal partnership and is available for an additional charge.

SPECIAL DIETARY REQUESTS

If you require a special diet or need specific food items during your cruise, or if you have any food allergies, we ask that you kindly submit your written dietary requests to our OBGSYacht@crystalcruises.com at least 90 days (three months) prior to departure.

We will do our utmost to accommodate each guest, however, due to the remote destinations we will be traveling in, it may be difficult to source certain items. Please also confirm your arrangements with your butler staff in the day of embarkation to ensure all is in order.

NOTE: there may be a charge for some special requests, as well as any applicable shipping fees.

Please note that we are unable to offer Kosher meals on *Crystal Endeavor*.

AS YOU WISH CREDITS

As You Wish shipboard credits are subject to change and may be adjusted or denied based on changes to the reservation, such as category assignment, fare revisions or travel dates. Credits may not be applied as a deduction toward current or future cruises, toward taxes fees and port charges, prepaid shore excursions, airfare add-ons, or medical expenses.

Credits may not be applied to cancelled reservations (whether paid in part or in full) and are not covered by Crystal's Cruise Protection Plan. Credits are nonredeemable for cash, are not transferable, are valid for only one sailing (defined as a booking), and are applicable on board.

SATELLITE RECEPTION

This is out of our control and we apologize for any inconvenience it may cause. Crystal Expedition Cruises cannot guarantee that communication connections for telephone, television, Internet or email will be available at all times in all areas of the world.

Depending on countries visited, U.S. residents are allowed a duty-free exemption of \$200, \$300 or \$1,600 USD. There are limits on the amount of alcoholic beverages, cigarettes, cigars and other tobacco products you may include in your duty-free personal exemption. Customs regulations are subject to change without notice, and guests are responsible for familiarizing themselves with the regulations.
